

Voted the Most Improved Driver in 1972, the general shop foreman of Bert's Automotive also belongs to the Westwood Committee and is a member of the R.D.C.





M.E.T.A. MEETING OF JUNE 17th 1976

The meeting opened with the minutes of the previous meeting and the financial report which shows us with a balance of \$140.71.

The Player's race was discussed, with some objections to the way we had to work until 7:30 pm after having been told that the cut off time would be 6:00 pm. A letter of thanks was received from Rob Tanner. The reason for continuing the Player's race in spite of the inclement conditions was that 35 laps had to be completed in order to become an official race. Once the 35 laps had been completed the race official's decision was that conditions were improving so the race was allowed to continue to its normal completion.

The club gave her some flowers and a card signed by all members present as a small consolation. The only other problem during the races was one of crowd control.

Plans were finalized to assist Richard Barwell with the Mission Days display on July 3rd. We were also able to procure the Bert Laakman Porsche.

Proposed upcoming events are another camping trip to Copper Creek on the 1st of August weekend and a banquet/dance on the 2nd of October.

The Jack Sher incident of the last race was again brought up and it was announced that the 60 day suspension imposed by the Race Committee has been recinded and replaced with a 30 day suspension instead. In addition a number of conditions we attached to the 30 day penalty.

The long awaited club crests have arrived and are available to members only from Ruby Stretton for the small sum of \$2.00.
