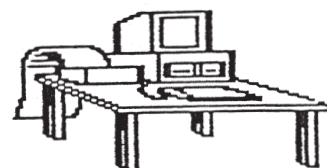
Rick Neyedli remains as Past-President.

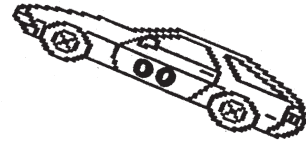
