
Ann Peters for getting the Mayday to the printers, stuffing the envelopes, mailing the Mayday, and her articles.

So here is an opportunity for someone to do this newsletter because it is important to the club as an information source.



ICE RACING WITH W.C.I.R.A.B.C.

So it's been two months since the last race of the year and your suffering from turnworker withdrawal. You know that a few devious minds are planning strange happenings for the upcoming META Rally but you just have to wave a flag before April.

Don't despair, as the Western Canadian Ice Racing Association of B.C. starts revving their engines for the January and February races at Barnes Lake in Ashcroft, B.C.. Being a turnworker takes on a whole new meaning at ice racing.

The first rule of conduct is that Warm is better than Whites. Considering the winter surroundings, white is not the colour of choice for an ice race track. Almost any other colour goes, provided that it prepares you for snow, wind and very c-c-c-cold weather.

An ice racing course is created by the snow plow on a frozen lake, so every weekend the track is different. Cones and tires are placed in strategic locations to mark the edge of the track and corners. This year, turnworkers will be given thick rubber mats to stand on so their feet don't become part of the track.

Cars will race in two different categories; either studded tires or rubber to ice (non-studded tires). Each of these two categories is broken into three classes which are conventional drive (engine at one end and drive wheels at the other), non conventional drive (front engine-front wheel drive or rear engine-rear wheel drive) or four wheel drive.

Watching these groups race together is truly exhilarating. Non conventional drive cars take a completely different line through corners as conventional drive cars. As a result, there are two locations at every corner where each of their optimum drive lines will cross. Now think about that in relation to passing. Put that together with a bunch of crazies who drive sideways for fun and you get one heck of a good show for any turnworker or spectator. When you consider that the drivers are on a track which is constantly slippery (better slippery than wet) it is understandable to see the odd "snow bank flat tow" at the end of a session. If the snow is light and the FIA curbing (snow bank) is low, then four wheels off can go a few hundred yards off track! It sure is nice to know that workers don't tend to push cars when they stick it in the snow.

As an added bonus for braving the cold, WCIRABC pays for hotel rooms and lunches for the benefit of enthusiastic turnworkers to come up and enjoy the show. This year their sponsored by Michelin and IWE Rear Ends Only, and there's some suggestion of awards or door prizes for the persistent few who can attend more than one weekend.

If you need accommodations (camping out gets a little chilly) to work a race, please contact Brian Meakings or Steve Bibby in advance to confirm space. For those who don't enjoy driving in snow, rides can be arranged for people wanting to attend both days in one weekend. See you at the track!
