### Annual Worker Awards Nomination

These awards are important and the club members are the ones who are having a say at who these awards are going to. Consider who you think should get these awards.

### <u>President's Award</u> ( META Worker of the year )

This award is presented to a member who displays exceptional contribution to the Association and the sport on and off the track. Candidates must be members in good standing for one full membership year and have attended at least 75% of the races as a paid up META member. If there is no local racing, out-of-town races must be substatntiated by logbook.

### The META Rookie of the Year ( New META member )

The rookie of the year must have been a paid member in good standing for one full membership year and attend at least 50% of the races as a paid up META member. If there is no local racing, out-of-town races worked must be substantiated by logbook.

### The Non-META Worker of the year

Must not be a META member.

The nomination sheet is in the Mayday and you nominate a person and then you give the reason(s) why this person should win. The nomination is then agreed upon by 3 other people.

### Executive Positions for AGM

- President The president chairs all meetings, is the spokesperson for the club and gives direction to the executive.
- Vice-president Takes over the duties of the president in his or her absence.
  - Secretary This person writes and files all club correspondence, and keeps the minutes of all meetings.
  - Treasurer Keeps all the financial records of the club, does all the club banking, arranges to have the books audited once a year.

Remember: A good executive is one where all the people work as a team and are working for the good of the club and not for themselves.


### Track Thought(s):

Let's do something crazy and go for a drive. Where? Where else but PORT ORFORD of course. Everyone knows where that is and if you don't, it's in the southern end of Oregon on the west cost. For those that don't understand that, it's a 12 hour drive from Vancouver, a 9 hour drive from Seattle, which includes one good meal stop and a couple of gas stops. Yes it is a very long drive, but going down I allowed time for some sightseeing of the Oregon Coast. Since I had made this trip over ten years ago, I was looking for familiar landmarks not thinking how much things would be changed either by man or nature. Needless to say, some of the sights I had wanted to see did not happen, but that was OK for it did make Friday a pleasant drive. We got to the race track at about 4:00pm on Friday and looked things over until about six and then drove into Port Orford which was only 10 minutes away. An ideal grid size for this track, in my opinion, would be about twenty-five cars. Yes there was excellent racing and of course an excellent H production race with local JOHN BOYKO winning in a hotly contested race. There were a couple of other drivers from B.C.; Paul, number 54 Formula V from Vancouver Island and a black and white RX7 from Vancouver. I do apologize if I left any out.



Above is a layout of the race course. There is approximately seven turns by normal count, but with the limited number of personnel to man flag stations, only four stations were used. With the limited information given, can you figure out where the flag stations were located and/or where you would put them.

All in all, the trip was worth it. If it was a once a year event, I would consider doing it again, but without a long weekend involved in B.C., you do need Friday and Monday off to do it. Leaving Thursday night would allow you to do some sightseeing on Friday of the Oregon coast which is loaded with things to see.

What more can I say, except - LET'S DO IT ALL AGAIN NEXT YEAR!


