

Letter from the President

As we begin a New Year, and we take the opportunity to recharge our batteries before the race season begins again, I have been doing some serious thinking about our club, what it stands for and what it means to me.

We try hard to do a professional job at all times, to continue to learn and to encourage new members to join, bringing new ideas and differing views with them. This, I feel, is essential for the continuing growth of a vibrant club like META. Without it, we would become stale and eventually might see the club stagnate to the point that nobody would want to belong. I hope that day never comes.

My past year as President has not been easy, but then nobody said it would be. I think I have learned a lot, and I hope I will go on learning. The Executive has tried to give everyone a fair hearing, even if the views have been somewhat radical to some of the members, but this is what being a democratic organization means. However, I think that at times we have got so bogged down in the technicalities of the correct procedures (Robert's Rules, our Policies and Procedures, etc.) that we have lost the focus of what META is all about, and this really concerns me.

What does belonging to META mean to you? To me, META's primary function is to promote safety in motorsport, to train new workers in the correct procedures and to set an example for others to follow. We should never forget that we are all volunteers, and will bring out the best in everyone if we try to make sure that they enjoy themselves, do an excellent job, and have fun at the same time. It's function should not be to accumulate money without an end in mind, to take advantage of our charity status, or to provide a platform for those in it for the glory, and not for the good of the sport. We should be working along with the SCCBC to run Mission effectively, working with other organizations to promote motorsport, particularly the safety aspect, and not creating separate camps within our own club.

What the Executive has discussed is writing a 'mission statement' for META, which is something being done by many successful organizations, but for it to work, we need to have your input. The final result can be very short, some statements are no more than a few words, but should clearly state what META stands for, for every member, so that when the going gets tough, we can all remind ourselves of what we are as a Club and what our priorities should be. To do it well, we need your involvement - I have given my personal views above, but we would like to hear yours. So while you are curled up in front of the fire this winter, give some thought to what META means to you, and let the Executive know - it can be anonymous if you prefer. But we promise to read all of the ideas and suggestions and to use your input to create a more united and committed Club in the months to come.



META has applied to the Government to receive funding (big \$\$) from the operation of a charity casino. The Government has approved, but has instructed us to include the following "Dissolution Clause" in the Constitution for META. In simple terms, the clause states that if META ever ceases to be, we are to pay all of our bills and then give any money which remains to another registered charity similar to our rwn.

At our General Meeting on January 25, 1995, members will vote on adding the following to our Constitution:

DISSOLUTION CLAUSE

In the event of the winding up or dissolution of the Society, all the funds and assets of the Society remaining after the payment or satisfaction of all costs, charges, expenses, debts and liabilities of the Society, including the remuneration (if any) of a liquidator, and after payment to employees of the Society of any arrears of salaries or wages, and after the payment of any debts of the Society, shall be given, transferred and distributed to such organization that are registered charities pursuant to the provisions of the Income Tax Act that shall be designated by the members of the Society at the time of the winding up or dissolution of the Society, and if effected cannot be given to the aforesaid provisions, such funds shall be given, transferred and distributed to such organizations that are determined by the members of the society to be registered charities pursuant to the provisions of the Income Tax Act which have purposes similar to those of the Society.

Dear Members,

I promised myself that I would write an article in every Mayday about various incidents from the past season and give ideas for solving the problems. I hope these will be helpful hints for everyone involved.

At a race, a car came out of the hairpin and stalled the engine. The driver restarted and the car continued but at a very low speed - approx 10 Kph towards the next turn. The rule for a slow vehicle is standing white.

Because the car was almost standing still and in a blind area, which was also a good passing area, I displayed a standing yellow to stop cars from passing. Standing yellow means car off track, yes, but if I had displayed waving yellow I would have stopped all cars from passing right up to start finish on the front raight. The standing yellow stopped the cars from passing for only a short __stance. I always think of safety first.
