IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR

RESTRAINT SYSTEMS



Shown: 5-Way CamLock Type Restraint System

- CamLock Buckle System CNC machined from 6061-T-6 billet aluminum alloy with hardened steel tumblers.
- 2) Stainless steel tabs (CamLock only).
- 3) Looped webbing adjuster.
- 4) Forged roller adjuster with slotted release tabs.
- Shoulder Harness: Military specification nylon webbing.
- 6) Computerized double tacked cross box sewing construction.
- Lap Belt: Military specification nylon webbing.
- 8) Heat cut and sealed webbing ends.
- 9) 3-Bar slide adjuster.
- 10) Forged bolt-in type hardware.
- 11) Anti-submarine belt: Military specification (whom webbing).



Become familiar with the installation, use, and operation of your system.

- 1) Anti-submarine belt should be anchored behind the chest line.
- Seat belts anchored apart, the width of driver, at an angle of 45 degrees to the floor of the car.
- 3) Anchor shoulder straps at a point four inches below top of shoulder.

4) Seat belt anchor should be positioned 2-1/2" forward of the driver's extended back line.

All mounting brackets should be attached directly to the frame or chassis of car, and installed to limit the driver's body travel both upward and forward. DO NOT MOUNT TO THE SHEET METAL FLOORBOARD.








Mounting brackets should be installed at an angle that is compatible with the direction of pull on the webbing under full load.

Minimum specification for bolts and washers to attach the seat belts, harnesses and anti-submarine belt hardware are Grade 8.

STRAP INSTALLATION

UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES ARE BOLTS INSERTED THROUGH BELT WEBBING ACCEPTABLE FOR MOUNTING.









ANSWERS TO COMMON QUESTIONS ABOUT RESTRAINT SYSTEMS

- Q: Why doesn't Simpson stock belts and restraint systems?
- A: Every system is made when ordered to insure a current SFI date.
- Q: How often should I reweb my belts or have my belts inspected?
- A: Some Sanctioning Bodies require the belts or system be rewebed two years after the date stamped on the SFI tag. However a belt that is fraying, been exposed to harmful chemicals or the environment may need to be rewebed sooner. Consult your Sanctioning Body for more information. In any event other than normal use. DO NOT USE THE SYSTEM AGAIN. EVEN IF IT APPEARS OK. Return to Simpson for inspection. Simpson will inspect and reweb only Simpson Products.
- Q: What is the advantage to "Pull-up" or "Pull-down" type belts?
- A: Which one you use is a matter of personal preference and the equipment you're using. For example, does the belt go through the seat? Will you adjust it, or someone on the crew? What hardware works best with your set-up? Bolt-in, Clip-in, or Wraparound? The "Pull-ups" are 62" in length. The "Pull-downs" are 52" in length.
- Q: Are Simpson Restraint Systems DOT (Department of Transportation) approved?

A: No. Simpson Systems are SFI approved and dated.
