



RESTORING AN OLD CAR

During the winter of 1994/5 I was tempted by the urge to restore an old car. It had to be British, of course, it had to be unusual and restoration had to be feasible. I had seen, from time to time, an advert in the Western Driver for a 1950 Jowett Javelin. Now every one asks what is a Jowett Javelin. The answer is: it was made by the Jowett Car Company in Bradford Yorkshire from about 1948 to 1954 when the company went out of business. They had been around since 1901, but had taken on a car design which they did not have adequate resources to manufacture at a high enough rate to be profitable. The Javelin model was a fast back styled car that had a 1.5 litre flat four water cooled engine, independent front suspension, and a rear axle located by twin parallel links and a panhard rod. The suspension was by longitudinal torsion bars. The body and frame were constructed as a unitized structure. The interior was carpeted, and had a wooden dash board and leather upholstery. The whole car was designed by one man, Gerald Thomas, who was hired in 1942 from the MG Car Company. He later went back to the MG car company and later designed a number of cars for BMC. The Javelin has recently been discovered by the British Classic Car magazine, and selected as the best 1950's sports sedan. More recent aerodynamic assessment gives a Cd factor of 0.39, which is comparable to many current designs.

I remembered these cars from my school days when one of our local doctors used them. They had a reputation for being very fast for their class, and in fact scored a number of victories in races and rallies. About 23,000 were made, the car I eventually bought was one of 416 imported into Canada, and had originally been sold in Vancouver. It finished up in Naramata, and was taken off the road in 1958. It spent some time in an orchard and was stored inside for a while. When I bought it, it had been purchased with the intent of restoration and was stored outside again, but well wrapped up. The engine had been taken out in 1958 and was in pieces. I was able to get a colleague to inspect it for me and to take some pictures, he reported that it appeared to be rust free and in sound condition. I succumbed and duly had it transported to my home near Prince George.

The first summer was spent cleaning a lot the mud from inside, and from off the underside. A local builder of stock car race engines took on the task of putting the engine back together. I was fortunate to obtain a lot of technical information about the car, and the detailed parts list and diagrams helped enormously. There is a Jowett Car Club and they maintain a parts service. I also discovered someone in England who rebuilt these engines as a sideline, so had lots of help at the end of the telephone.

Work only proceeds in the summer as our daily car has to go into the garage during the winter. My Corvette is the other inhabitant of the garage, and that does not live outside in any season. Winter tends to be spent researching sources for parts, and getting things redone. This winter the door panels will be recovered, and I hope to get the dashboard back from a cabinet maker who is repairing some water damage in his spare time.

The engine is now back in the car, and I have had the starter motor turning the engine over to try and get the oil circulating. I have found some leaks and they are fixed. Next year should see the engine firing, and the car mobile under its own power. I would like to get the body painted, and a start on reinstalling the interior. The seats will be the last project. As they will take five skins of leather, as I dread to think of the cost.

So if one day you see a strange British car at Mission, that looks like a small Lincoln Zephyr, it might be my Jowett Javelin.


