saturday afternoon cruise ...







Storage arrange for suitable secure storage with either a member or donated or rented facility (garage)

Sponsorship--The club can pursue sponsors to cover some or all of the operational costs for the vehicle in exchange for advertising signage or MAYDAY ads.

Cleaning: the responsibility of the primary driver--(detailing sponsor?)

Questions were then answered from the floor, valid concerns were raised and receive input from committee to address. Money for the maintenance and for insurance in future years were a concern. The discussion actually lasted from the break until 21:45. Approx. 50 min.
