

#### **ICE RACING IS BEYOND HOPE!!**

Ice racing is here again, who said there's nothing to do in the winter. Although I wasn't there the first weekend, I understand things went very well. 17 cars, good weather, and enough workers for 4 stations, however only 1 META worker (Sandy). There were some problems on communications, but that was bound to happen with inexperienced workers. One thing that I heard about was an Alert being called for something minor like a tire on the track. I said that's nothing, I was at a conference race in Spokane one time, where the Starter called an Alert for a car pulling off mechanical onto an escape road. Stuff happens; don't worry, be happy. Other than that, Nolans' turbo Mini broke an axle, and Murrays' turbo propane Prelude blew an engine, both were back the second weekend. There was one open car from Kelowna that won all the studded races, and only 2 Chevettes which ran in the open grid. A good weekend, but the one thing Wayne kept repeating "We sure miss you guys, we sure miss you guys". I felt bad, but you can only do so much, and we intended on being there for the second weekend, which was also the first Enduro.

The second race weekend started out good and kept getting better. We left Friday during the day and had a really good drive up. We went up to the lake to see the track and check the ice. The track looked great but the ice was breaking up at the edges of the lake. Déjà vu all over again. Oh well, we're here anyway, it was getting colder and we weren't going to worry about it. Off to the Desert Motel to check in and relax a bit, then over to the Wander Inn for dinner, then to the Oasis for the better part of the evening. Some more workers showed up, some drivers came over, and a good time was had by all (at least as far as I remember Oh well).

One of things I like about ice racing; morning meetings are at 9:00, that's a good thing. A quick head count showed 6 META workers and a bunch more volunteers. Not as many as we hoped, but enough to go around. Jo A. was our Starter, Karen F., Steve B., Sandy K., and Alex K. on the turns. I lucked out and drove the rescue truck with a Medics Asst. I say lucked out because it cooled off lots overnight and got really windy.

Noel K. was Clerk of the Course, so I asked him where he would like the turn stations located. He said "Oh, I don't know, last time I just drove around and put them wherever it looked good, I figured if the workers didn't like it, they'd just move the station". I said that sounds good to me; and it was then I knew it was going to be a stress free, laid back race weekend, just the way I like it. Races were a little late getting going (in other words normal) but once they did, they went very well. There were enough Chevettes (8) to have their own grid so as the open cars were coming off, the vettes were gridded and ready, a quick cleanup and they came out, then when they were coming off the open cars were gridded and ready to go. Almost non stop action, great stuff.

The Enduro was cut from 2 hrs to 1 ½ hrs because it would have been too cold for the workers and because things were late, but with 25 cars {including vettes), it was really good racing. The surprise winner was Doug & Pat Hurd in a very quick Fiesta. It was said that Doug hasn't finished better than second place for 18 years, good for him. Most of the cars survived the weekend, but there were 2 Alerts. One during the Enduro for an oil fire after a blown engine, the other, on Sunday, for Pats' Fiesta involved in a heavy impact with Wayne's Daytona (unavoidable). Both drivers were OK. The impact happened during the best race of the day, when Pat, Wayne and Murray were battling for the lead. Pat was faster on the straight, then Wayne and Murray would pass going into the sweeper, Pat would then repass them coming out, then the same thing at the other sweeper, lap after lap. Great racing.

It really was a great weekend. Ice racing is really a grass roots sport where the main goal it seems is to enjoy yourself. Where else could you have fun with "Moo Moo Moo Moo" & "Breaker, Breaker, Good Buddy" too and not feel the wrath of some far too serious Race Chair that thinks he is God.

How many other race organizations have a mandatory Happy Hour on Saturday night (Chums), or provide 2 free rooms for workers (Desert Motel) or hot lunches, or shortened enduros, etc, etc, etc.

For those who haven't been you need to try it at least once. For those that have been there and know what I'm talking about, quit whining about the cold and come out and have some fun.



For those of you who do not know yet, the Vancouver Indy Race is on 1999. The Track, as is normal for this event, will change somewhat from last year's track.

It has been confirmed that there will not be Indy Lights in Vancouver for 1999. What the other support race will be is still unknown.

I.C.S.C.C. will be using transponders to time all cars at Conference events. This means that small boxes will be attached to each car, and timing can be carried out using a lap-top computer and very few timing staff - something that all tracks are short of these days.

Speaking of Conference, the annual Labour Day race at Port Orford has been moved to a new venue. Team Continental, the host club, has lost use of the Cape Blanco Airport in Port Orford. The Race is now scheduled to run the same weekend, but at the Thunder Hill race track in Redding, California.

Anyone who was following the amphitheater debate at Portland will be glad to know it has been defeated. "S.C.C.A. City" is safe- there will not be an amphitheater built over it. This means no conflict between concerts and races.
