Seattle Set For Improvements

Kent, Wash., Jan. 8 — We have it on unimpeachable authority that work begins this week to improve racing conditions at Seattle International Raceway in Kent, Wash.

Our source reports that Penal Construction will begin grinding the racing surface in an effort to level out the bumps that actually had some car flying in recent years.

This will not be the final effort made to improve SIR, with additional changes scheduled to take place after current manager Jim Rockstad's lease expires at the end of 2001.

The Fiorito family, which owns the facility, has been somewhat quiet about its plans, but they definitely do not include a lease extension for Rockstad. The track will reportedly get a complete facelift, which is said to include a new tower and media facilities. This work will hopefully take place prior to the 2002 race which, if the date follows tradition, would be sometime in early August.

There's some question as to who might run the facility after Rockstad's departure. The Fioritos may take over the day-to-day operations themselves, or bring in an outside management firm, but that won't be decided before the end of the year.

Any improvement in the racing surface at SIR will be greatly appreciated by both competitors and fans, as no other facility on the NHRA Winston Series circuit has received the kind of consistent negative press that's plagued SIR for the last several years. In numerous driver interviews conducted over the last year, SIR has consistently come up on the top of most racers' "Wish-we-didn't-have-to-go-there" lists. Many have also mentioned that the physical beauty of the area is completely negated by the condition of the facility.

Give the Fioritos – and NHRA – credit for trying to improve the situation, something that's bound to keep moving in the right direction in the future. — *Jon Asher, Senior Editor, RACER*

Racin' cars for Merritt Mountain

If you build it, they will come and race cars. Maybe take in a concert, too.

After a decade without a major auto-racing track in B.C., contractors expect to begin moving earth in March to lay out Active Mountain Raceway near Merritt, about 200 kilometres east of Vancouver. The combination 1.2-kilometre tri-oval and 3.5-km road course is part of an ambitious \$250-million entertainment complex, including a hotel, concert stages, amusement park, golf course and camping/RV facilities.

Developer Claude Lelievre, organizer of the Merritt Mountain Music Festival that draws 100,000 fans annually to hear big-name country stars, shrewdly hopes to combine racing and rhythm guitars.

"We have events planned that will be racing in the afternoon, concerts in the evening," he say's.

"That's very unusual because most tracks are not equipped or don't have the knowledge and connections in the entertainment industry to mix the two of them."

But for racing fans, the prospect of seeing Garth Brooks strut the stage is less enticing than watching Michael Andretti turn a hot lap.

Except for a small track near Mission, the West Coast has been without a major racing venue since Westwood was plowed up for a Coquitlam subdivision about 10 years ago.

Proposals to build a new track near Vancouver foundered on opposition from suburban municipalities, which don't want the noise, the crowds or the traffic.

Race buffs have been left with an annual fix — the Vancouver Molson Indy, run Labour Day weekend on a downtown waterfront temporary street circuit. Even that is in jeopardy as CART considers moving the race out of Vancouver after 2001.

Active Mountain's promoters think their facility ultimately could provide a solution, luring big-time series, including Winston Cup or Busch Cup stock cars, Superbike motorcycles or perhaps even CART.

"We're going to build it to their standards and then we're going to try and attract them," says Trevor Seibert, who designed the tracks and is overseeing construction.

Active Mountain's initial goals are more modest. Project co-ordinator Jerry Kroll says the organization is hoping to land lower-tier races, such as Formula Atlantic, CASCAR and maybe American Le Mans endurance sports-car events.

Active Mountain hopes to host four to six races when it opens in the spring of 2002, says Kroll. The track, located on a defunct mine property owned by Lelievre, will also look for revenue generators such as performance and police-driving schools and automakers looking for test-driving facilities.
