RANDALL — Robert Cheetham

It is with a deep sense of loss that we say 'farewell to a flier', Robert Cheetham Randall, our father, grandfather, and great-grandfather, passed away peacefully in his sleep on December 11th, 2004 at the age of 96 years, joining in heaven his life mate of 74 years, Hilda.

Robert C. Randall or Bob as he was known to most, was born in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan on November 2, 1908. Bob spent his career as a pilot, earning his license in 1928. His flying accomplishments included mapping the western Yukon and eastern Alaska with Bradford Washburn's National Geographic Expedition in the 1930s, being the first to land on a glacier, and flying Canadian Pacific Airlines' newly developed international routes in the 1950s. He was one of the initial inductees to Canada's Aviation Hall of Fame. When he retired at the age of 60 he had logged over 31,000 hours as pilot in command!

As well, Bob was actively involved in the Sports Car Club of BC and the International Conference of Sports Car Clubs, volunteering for over 40 years in many capacities including at the Indy Race in Vancouver. Bob leaves to mourn, his sister Edith, sons Bob Jr., Ted (Sharon), John (Pri), daughter Joan, fourteen grandchildren and thirteen great-grandchildren, many nieces, nephews and friends. Bob was predeceased by his wife Hilda, sisters, Florie and Phylis, brother Ted, and grandson Brian as well as Rick Kilburn.

By his choice, Bob will be cremated, with no funeral service. A Celebration of Life will be held in the late afternoon, with dinner, on the 7th of May, 2005 at Misson Raceways.

EARLY EDMONTON ACTIVITY EXCEEDING EXPECTATIONS AS CANADIAN CITY READIES FOR INAUGURAL CHAMP CAR WORLD SERIES EVENT

INDIANAPOLIS (December 13, 2004) - One of the cornerstones of the Bridgestone Presents The Champ Car World Series Powered by Ford is in the support it receives from the fans, business leaders and government officials at each stop it makes in Canada.

More than 133,000 fans have come out to every one of the 37 Champ Car events ever held in Canada, so it would stand to reason that the newly-announced race to be held July 17 in Edmonton would be met with a good dose of enthusiasm.

But mere enthusiasm apparently does no justice to the response that the city of Edmonton and the province of Alberta have given to the inaugural Edmonton Grand Prix as ticket sales and business interest has exceeded all forecasts in the first weeks of availability. Event sales began less than one week ago and the phones have been ringing off the hook ever since the December 7 launch.

"The response has been absolutely beyond our wildest imagination," said Edmonton Grand Prix General Manager Greg MacDonald. "We had 40 suites forecast in our original budget but we will have 80 sold by next week. Ticket sales have been great and we haven't even started selling general admission passes yet. The three-day ticket packages have been flying out of here."

Race organizers will have grandstands to seat 48,000 fans erected around the City Center Airport layout. The track layout has been designed with those seats in mind, providing fans with the ability to see as much as 95 percent of the action at any time.

"Our Canadian markets have always been strong performers in terms of support for the Champ Car product. These early sales results in Edmonton however are nothing short of amazing and a credit to the promoter and the great City of Edmonton," said Executive Vice President of Development Joe Chrnelich. "This type of performance is also a great indication that Champ Car open wheel racing is on the move, has broadbase market appeal and is poised for business growth going into the 2005 season."

Phone now!!! Here's the info again from my previous e-mail...

The room prices next summer are \$79.00 - he is prepared to discount them by \$9.00 a night and offer them to us for \$70.00 for either single or double, \$10.00 extra for additional guests. They have a few queens but mostly double beds. No roll-aways (they found they damaged the rooms).

Even though the race isn't until July, folks should call to make their reservations now. The hotel is 4 miles away from the City Airport and is a straight shoot down the Yellowhead Highway. They have a 24 hour restaurant, gas station ... and I know this will be popular with some of the folks - a liquor store!

As my fiddler friend said - it ain't the Ritz, but it's clean, the folks are friendly, and it's inexpensive. The time I 've told him we'd be looking at is checking in on Wednesday, July 13th, and checking out on Monday, July 18th. Some may not come until later or may leave earlier, but I wanted to give him a ballpark idea.

So, advise members to call 1-800-343-8533 (toll free), give their dates and the name META and make those reservations early!

GORDON KIRBY'S INSIDE TRACK

Wednesday, December 22, 2004

All of a sudden Christmas is upon us. I hope you fans of the Champ Car World Series are enjoying the spirit of the season. You deserve the thanks of everyone in the sport for your great support and I'm sure everyone who earns their living in the business will join me in offering a toast to you, your families and friends.

Thanks to all of you and to Messrs Kalkhoven, Forsythe and Gentilozzi the sport we love has survived a tumultuous few years and appears to have a bright new future with the focus falling on the racers and the racing. We all hope and believe that's what the 2005 Champ Car season will be about. That's my biggest Christmas wish and here are a few more.

Good rides for Ryan Dalziel and Michael Valiante. Both these kids have shown a lot of ability in Toyota Atlantic and they've demonstrated in recent months that they can drive a Champ Car too. Dalziel created a big impression at PKV Racing when he tested for the team at Sebring last month and it looks like he may have beaten Bjorn Wirdheim to getting the job as Jimmy Vasser's teammate at PKV in '05.

Valiante of course, was very impressive in one of Derrick Walker's Reynards in Mexico City. Valiante is a very cool analytical driver. I remember the first time I saw him in action in Skip Barber's annual Big Scholarship run-off five years ago. Even then, when he was still a teen-ager, Valiante clearly had an uncanny feel for the car. He was quickly able to diagnosis any changes we made to the car's set-up and was also very fast and consistent In that way there was a similarity between Valiante and A.J. Allmendinger who competed in Barber's now-defunct Big Scholarship a couple of years later and has gone on to do great things.

So please Santa, make sure you've got a pair of good seats in your bag for Dalziel and Valiante. And let's not forget to find a good ride for Wirdheim too. The 2003 FIA F3000 champion is an excellent driver and will be a great addition to the Champ Car field.

My next Christmas wish is for a much better TV production than the past year! Champ Car has done a great thing in getting half a dozen races on network TV next year and also getting back live on Eurosports after having all but fallen off the map across the pond in 2004. Obviously, we hope the rest of TV package will be equally strong, and that includes the quality of the show itself. And wouldn't it be great too, to see more coverage of qualifying as well as a weekly news show featuring my friend Robin Miller. All these things Santa, I'd love to see.

Another great Christmas gift would be the return of Cristiano da Matta to Newman/Haas and the birth of Newman/Haas's three-car superteam. From what I understand both the sponsorship and the will and commitment from within the team to make it happen are there. But if my sources are correct Santa, there's a Christmas grinch who's looking too fiercely at the bottom line and not embracing the power in the romantic notion of three-car superteam. If you could make Newman/Haas's grinch smile and think big Santa, you'd have as many Champ Car fans looking for your autograph as they do Newman's.

I'd also love to see a plan developed over the next year for the revitalization of the Toyota Atlantic series and the entire ladder series. This is a big job that I know Champ Car is committed to and I believe that part of that developing plan should be a recreation of Skip Barber's Big Scholarship program. I was proud to be a member of the judging panel for Skip's Big Scholarship because it provided a real leg up to young drivers with a \$150,000 prize paid towards the winner's next racing season as well as a bout of good publicity. And of course, Ryan Hunter-Reay, Allmendinger and Valiante are all previous Big Scholarship winners and they'll all tell you that competing for that prize was an important step in their rise to prominence.

Looking further down the road Santa, I'd like the plant the seeds for a couple of future Christmas gifts you might enjoy going to work on. The first of these is a return to Vancouver. For fifteen years Vancouver was a great venue for Champ Car racing. It's a beautful, very civilized city with a tremendous fan following for our sport.

Champ Car's executive vice-president Joe Chrnelich has clearly stated the organization's desire to race again in Vancouver following the 2010 Winter Olympics. When you're flying over Vancouver on Christmas Eve Santa, why don't scout the place for the right location? Once again Santa, the fans of the Champ Car World Series would be equally big fans of yours if you could find a location that provided both a great racetrack and some fine vistas of the Vancouver skyline and mountains.

Finally Santa, I've got a big longterm challenge for both you and Champ Car. I'm one of those who firmly believes that top-class open-wheel motor racing must continue to operate near the limits of technology. It's always been an essential part of the sport and was in fact the driving influence in the sport's greatest days, whether that was the great board track era of the twenties, or the sixties and early seventies when the cars changed out of all recognition and lap speeds went through the roof, or CART's best days in the eighties and nineties.

Let's not forget that for most of the twentieth century motor racing always professed to "improve the breed", and from the rear-view mirror to the development of pneumatic and then wide-profile tires as well as rear-engine cars, monocoque and stressed steel chassis, supercharging, turbocharging, composite chassis and the lessons learned about crash safety and impact absorption, there's no question that racing has contributed a huge amount to the modern passenger car.

But today, racing has actually fallen behind the car industry in contributing anything at all to the search for new fuels and pollution-free powerplants. Toyota has blazed the way with the hybrid and many other manufacturers are following in their footsteps. Fuel cell cars also will soon arrive in the market. Meanwhile all forms of automobile racing worldwide cling to the antique internal combustion engine.

Wouldn't it be a tremendous thing for the sport to see Champ Car take the bull by the horns and create an experimental category for engines other than carbon-fuel burning powerplants? It would take a lot of thinking and planning and would be difficult to execute correctly, but to announce a daring reach into the future for, say 2009, would show the rest of the world that Champ Car is a sanctioning body unlike any other.

Can you put your elves to work on that idea Santa? And with that, another toast to you all, and to all a good night!




