You all know of the struggles my brother's wife, Brenda, has gone through these past three years with her breast cancer battle. Sadly, she lost that battle on Canada Day, July 1, 2006. The end came much, much sooner than any of us were prepared for, especially my brother Paddy and nephew Sean.

Somehow the disease went into warp speed, and by Sunday, June 25th, she was having so much trouble breathing she had to be admitted to hospital. She felt fine, but she needed oxygen to help with her breathing. She was completely focused on getting well enough to be able to attend Sean's grad dance on Friday, June 30th. Her breathing continued to worsen, however, and it became apparent that she wasn't going to be able to make the dance. Instead, focus shifted to bringing her home, and plans were being made for that transition. Sean and his good friend Melissa stopped by the hospital on their way to the dinner dance and Brenda was thrilled to see them. Paddy, mom and I were with her earlier in the day and again that evening after Sean and Melissa had been by. Brenda wanted me to make sure folks knew that she wasn't in any pain, she just couldn't get enough oxygen. We had a nice visit, I had brought her some new PJ's, and she asked if I could do her a big favour and make her some organic beef barley soup. We laughed going over the ingredients - this one called for turnip, which Paddy and I hate!!! - and also the fact that it was going to be ME making the soup ... I don't cook! As we kissed our goodbyes, she said to us "DON'T WORRY!" - I turned to her as I headed out and said - and don't YOU worry either.

The next morning, Saturday, July 1st, Paddy got a call from the hospital saying he'd better make his way there quickly, but by the time he and Sean arrived, she'd already gone. Mom and I joined them at the hospital and we all said our final goodbye. It has been a very difficult couple of days, and still seems surreal. Family is preparing to fly out and we are making plans for a memorial service on Friday. As many of you were part of my "Weekend to End Breast Cancer" walk the summer before last, and you are all dear friends, I felt I should share this sad news with you. My brother has been keeping us all updated on Brenda's progress. Thank you for your friendship and your caring thoughts and prayers. As my brother says, give those near and dear to you a hug ... and this is my hug sent your way.


