Moore Exhibit Captures the Racer's Edge

BC Sports Hall of Fame: Definitive collection tells story of average kid fulfilling big dream Ed Willes

When the son died over seven years ago it left a hole in the father's heart that will never heal.

Sure, it's nice the folks at the B.C. Sports Hall of Fame have built a fitting tribute to his boy and, sure, it's nice that others can look at everything Greg Moore was and remember. But if you think this makes it easier for the dad, who was there every step of the way, right up until the end, well, it doesn't. His friends will tell you he's learned to get on with his life. That's about as much as you can ask of the man. "It's difficult," says Ric Moore. "It's always difficult."

And it will be difficult when he sees the permanent gallery built to honour his son for the first time, sees the wagon Greg had painted gold when he was a toddler, sees the car he was driving when he became the youngest winner in CART history, sees the hundreds of pieces of memorabilia, the pieces of a life taken far too soon. But Ric Moore, his second-wife Donna, Greg's mother, also named Donna, and Greg's step-family also knew this was necessary, that something permanent was needed to honour Greg's life.

And say this for everyone connected with this project they didn't squander this opportunity. "We thought this was a way a lot of people could share in everything Greg accomplished," says Ric Moore. "He was proud to be a B.C. boy. We have quite a number of heroes." He paused. "Maybe that's not the word but you can think of a better one." Actually, I couldn't if I tried.

Some four weeks from now, after two delays owing to the uncooperative roof at B.C. Place, the HOF will finally unveil its permanent Greg Moore exhibit and it will become the museum's marquee attraction. At 800 square feet it will be its largest gallery. It will have interactive and audiovisual features. It will have nine full showcases, featuring artifacts from every stage of Greg Moore's life: a poster of his boyhood hero Ayrton Senna, which used to adorn his bedroom wall, a high-school yearbook message from his pal Brendan Morrison, an autographed Fender given to Greg by the members of Metallica.

His Players' racing car, the car he drove in Milwaukee in his first CART win in '97, is the feature attraction and it's a powerful centrepiece. But it's not the car that carries the biggest impact nor are any of the gallery's individual components. Rather it's the totality of the exhibit and the story it represents. This was a kid, an average kid from Maple Ridge who had a big dream and lived to fulfill that dream.

The Hall of Fame's motto is: "Honour the Past. Inspire the Future." It seemed to be written with Greg Moore in mind. "It's almost eerie but you get to know a person you never met," says Jason Beck, the HOF's curator and part of a team that assembled the gallery. "We started referring to Greg in the first person around here. 'Greg wouldn't like this. Greg would like that."

The impetus for the Greg Moore gallery actually began a couple of years ago when Ric and Donna Moore were moving from their sprawling Maple Ridge home into a downtown condo. Ric had stored everything he'd kept from his son's career "Just a phenomenal amount of stuff," he says in a wing of the house that was seldom visited. His wife called the HOF and asked them if they'd be interested in any of that stuff.

A partnership was soon formed. About a year later, Ric Moore dropped off 30 or so boxes at the museum. Beck, the young curator, immediately grabbed one and the first thing he pulled out was Greg Moore's Players racing suit. "It gave me goosebumps," Beck says. "One of our thoughts was we didn't want Greg to be forgotten," says Ric Moore. That's not going to be a problem. For all the exhibit's detail, however, the most moving item has little to do with Greg Moore's career or his many victories and trophies. Rather, it's a blow-up of the young racer, his arms raised in triumph, forever young and beautiful. Around him, are some 50 messages taken from the 17,000 messages Players-Forsythe racing collected following his death on Oct 31, 1999. This is part of the message left by Max Papis, another CART driver.

"He is up there in the sky and these are the messages God sends to us. I'm so sad. There are no words, there is nothing."

But for 24 years there was a glorious life and it's here to celebrate.

The Gallery will open to the public on February 27th.

Schedule Announced for 2007 Oregon Region SCCA Road Racing Championship presented by Fluge Global Adventures

PORTLAND, Ore. – January 25, 2007 – The Oregon Region of the Sports Car Club of America (SCCA) announced today a six-race championship series along with the names of individual event supporters and a new, season-long sponsor. About Oregon Region SCCA

The Oregon Region of the Sports Car Club of America was established in the 1960's and has grown to its present membership of over 1,200 members. The Region obtained its charter from SCCA in 1962. It is a member oriented, member operated club with the primary purpose of "promoting, maintaining and improving automobile sports and interest in the ownership, operation of, and safety of sports cars."The roots of SCCA and Oregon Region run deep in racing history. The origin of SCCA can be traced back to the pre-World War II "Auto Racing Club of America" which disbanded because of World War II. Originally, the State of Oregon was included in the territory of Northwest Region, SCCA (NWR), and it remained that way until the official creation f Oregon Region in 1962. From its beginning, Oregon Region SCCA has been organizing and administering sports car/club racing events at Newport, Goshen (South of Eugene) and Portland's West Delta Park (now Portland International Raceway - PIR). The Region's first race was held at the Newport municipal airport (an ex-WWII air base) in 1962.

Currently, Oregon Region has active programs in Club Racing, Vintage Racing, Road Rally, Rallycross, and in Solo II - SCCA's autocross program where competitors compete against the clock in a controlled atmosphere. The Oregon region also provides workers and officials to major professional international racing competitions here in Oregon and across North America. 
