Lookin' good, feelin' better

Joanne Gadsden used to wear little makeup, if any. But now makeup has taken on a different meaning in her life: Not only does it make her look good, it makes her feel good.

Gadsden was the first Yuma participant in the Look Good ... Feel Better, a national program offered free of charge to women who are undergoing chemotherapy and radiation treatments. This program teaches cancer patients makeup and skin care techniques to help cope with appearance-related issues caused by these treatments, said Connie Carter, volunteer program coordinator in Yuma.

"It was really good information, not just beauty tips but how to feel good about putting on makeup differently, because everything changed (physically)," Gadsden said.

Gadsden was diagnosed with breast cancer in September and two months later started chemotherapy, which caused her to lose her hair and eyebrows, and her skin began to feel different.

She also has red spots on her face that appear sporadically after chemotherapy, she said.

"It's very nice to cover those things up ... being able to hide those made me feel really good," Gadsden said. The program, sponsored by CTFA (Cosmetic, Toiletry and Fragrance Association), American Cancer Society and the National Cosmetology Association, finds personalized solutions to hair loss, skin irritation and fingernail sensitivity problems that can result from cancer treatment, said Carter, a Yuma cosmetologist. "It's important because we as women are sensitive to how we look, and having this program is one more thing offered out there that people can come to and be themselves and not be awkward about asking questions because they're not alone," Carter said.

Each participant receives a makeup kit containing donated brand-name beauty products, worth about \$200, in addition to scarves and turbans donated by Hospice.

Cosmetologists go step by step with each participant so they learn how to correctly apply their makeup with confidence "so (it) doesn't look like pancake makeup and it looks very natural," Carter said.

They also go over different ways and styles of wearing scarves, hats, turbans and wigs.

Volunteer cosmetologists are trained to be able to lead the Look Good ... Feel Better program and never answer any medical questions, nor do they interfere with the patients' medical treatments, Carter said.

Right before receiving chemotherapy, Gadsden attended "chemo school," which "brings you so far down, makes you so crazy because they're telling you everything that could possibly go wrong. It was horrifying," she said.

Were this program not available, "I would have probably done nothing, I would have probably looked myself in the mirror and say 'oh my God' and just probably hid," Gadsden said. "It was just great to have something like this to make me feel like I was a lady again."

In the program, Gadsden learned to lock in her skin's moisture by putting on moisturizer all over her body while her body is still damp after a shower, she said.

To ensure that lipstick doesn't smudge on her teeth, she learned to put her lips around her finger after applying the lipstick and then pulling the finger out. Putting loose powder over a tissue over lips also helps seal the lipstick.

Cosmetologists "are very professional, very well-trained, very supportive and very fun," Gadsden said. The most valuable learning Gadsden took from the program is "that I don't have to be a slave to chemo, that it doesn't have to take over my life. I can make myself feel better," she said.

Champ Car World Series Tests Standing-Start Procedure For First Time In Preparation For 2007 Season Opener

ANGLETON, Texas (February 12, 2007) - Katherine Legge leisurely rolled her Dale Coyne Racing Cosworth/Panoz/Bridgestone Champ Car to a stop on the front straight as a rainy Monday faded to gloom, while rookie Graham Rahal sidled up alongside and stopped.

Both drivers fixed their eyes on a bank of lights perched over the track, revving their 750-horsepower Cosworth XFE powerplants higher and higher as each of the four red lights glowed one-by-one. The scarlet lights went dark as the two Champ Cars rocketed from their spots to make the first side-by-side test of Champ Car's new standing-start procedure - which will go into effect at the start of the 2007 season.

Champ Car will institute the standing-start procedure beginning in Las Vegas, marking the first time that the starting method will be used in the modern era of Champ Car World Series competition. Today, the drivers got their first chance for side-by-side practice of standing starts, albeit on a wet MSR Houston road course where rains cut the session from 60 to 30 minutes.

"The standings starts are going to bring a lot of excitement to Champ Car and definitely adds a whole new element to the race," said Legge. "You obviously don't want to stall the car at the start. You need to find a way to avoid wheel spin and get up through the gears as fast as you can. That's the way to have a good start." A damp morning gave way to heavy rains, which kept the Champ Cars in the garage for most of Monday afternoon. No one turned a wheel until Newman/Haas Racing's Sebastien Bourdais and Graham Rahal hit the track at 3:30, leading the way for an hour of late-session action topped by the initial 30 minutes of standing-start practice.

Nearly half the field took advantage of the opportunity while some teams had already retired to their garages by that time, trading the chance to work on their cars for splashing in the rain. Rahal was one of the few drivers in the field with fresh standing-start experience, having won five races from a full stop in last year's Champ Car Atlantic Championship, and spent most of the session working on his starts.

"It's much more difficult to do the starts in Champ Car because there's so much more power," Rahal said. "It's hard to put the power down on these cars as it is. In third gear coming out of a corner it can be hard to do so doing it from a stop is a tough thing, especially when it is wet."

The drivers and teams of the Champ Car World Series will have another hour to hone their starting skills, at the end of tomorrow's final day of testing at MSR Houston. The series will then prepare for its Spring Training test, to be held at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca on March 9th and 10th.





EDMONTON CHAMP CAR SUPPORT RACE

To help celebrate it's 50th anniversary the Northern Alberta Sports Car Club is planning a series of GT/Sports car support races to be held during the Champ Car Races at the Edmonton City Centre Airport, July 20-22, 2007.

In years past, when the Champ Car Event was held in downtown Vancouver, a highlight amongst racers and fans alike were the sedan support Races. These events offered exciting on-track action with fields of up to 50 Sports and GT cars locked in epic battles on the Champ Car course. The locally organized races were key in boosting interest in both the Champ Car Event as well as racing in general throughout Western Canada and the Northwestern USA.

We would like to bring that excitement and enthusiasm to the Grand Prix of Edmonton for 2007! The weekend already consists of the West Edmonton Mall Grand Prix of Edmonton Champ Car Race, two Toyota Atlantic races, as well as a NASCAR Canadian Tire road course race.

The field(s) will consist of Sports and GT Cars as well as properly prepared Vintage Race Cars. Approximate weights for the vehicles will be in the 2000-3400 lb range. Due to safety concerns the organizers cannot accept entries from either sports-racers or open wheel cars. As this is a very large spectator event (100,000 plus) vehicle appearance will be paramount in the entry selection process. A strict no-contact rule will apply. The entry fee has been set at \$1,500.00 CDN per car. This would include 4 general admission/paddock passes for driver & three crew as well as 2 grandstand passes. Edmonton Grand Prix has indicated that our entrants would be able to purchase additional grandstand passes at a discounted price. Paddock space of 600 square feet per entry has been requested. If extra space is available it will be rented out to those who require it. Additional expenses such as tent and transponder rental and fuel storage can be expected

The initial event plan was for a GT/Sports race run under Vintage rules. The variety of intended entries to date raises safety concerns involved with running a combined Vintage-GT field. Subject to enough pure Vintage entries we have revised the race proposal as follows:

Friday: 15 minute Vintage Qualifying Race

15 minute Sports/GT Qualifying Race

Saturday: 15 minute Vintage Sprint Race

15 minute Sports/GT Sprint Race

Sunday: 20 minute Vintage Feature Race

30 minute Sports/GT Feature Race

Please note that this format could change based on the final number of entrants in each category. If these changes affect your intentions to attend the event please contact us and let us know as soon as possible. We require accurate car counts to move forward with this event.

We are very close to filling our GT field, if you intent to participate please contact us via email with your car description, class and desired car number as soon as possible. We will keep you updated on this website as to the current event status.
