Dave Nex has put a lot of thought into where the new turn stations will be and where the safety trucks will be placed, all related to the speed the cars will be going, our safety and where the drivers will be looking, however expect adjustments as these are based on speculation and past experience.

The Auto Show is the first week in April, this is an excellent opportunity to bench race with prospective volunteers, spectators and participants. Although this may not benefit META directly, getting the word out does eventually filter down to us, even if it is just getting some younger kids switched onto the sport.

Roger is hoping to organize a radio control car event, possibly for the first race. If you own a radio control car, it's time to dust it off and 'tune it up', possibly change the rubber to something more suitable for asphalt. Nick is pushing for left turns only, at which my goal will probably be just to stay out of his way as he could just drive over my car as though it wasn't there.

## Champ Car out, but Mazdas will run

When the Champ Car World Series folded its tent and merged with rival Indy Racing League, plans for July's Mazda Grand Prix of Portland were thrown into chaos.

Without Champ Car to headline the weekend's attractions and pay for essential services, it was unclear whether other parts of the event could go on.

But Mazda has agreed to underwrite some events to be held July 25 through July 27 at Portland International Raceway. The move saves some degree of the professional sports car racing weekend on the eve of what would have been Champ Car's 25th anniversary.

The new event name has not been finalized, but the working title is the Grand Prix of Portland/MazdaSpeed Motorsports Festival.

"The Grand Prix of Portland is important enough that Mazda felt the need to step up and help make the 25th anniversary race happen," says Jim Jordan, marketing manager at Mazda North American Operations. "We'll be bringing a Star Mazda doubleheader, a round of the Playboy MX-5 Cup, and other races and motorsports." The Star Mazda series, which was a support race on Champ Car weekend, will anchor this year's event. The series uses identical open-wheel formula cars powered by Mazda rotary engines, so the race always comes down to driver ability and car setup.

Two Star Mazda races are scheduled, one on Saturday and the other on Sunday. The series is going to standing starts this year and features young drivers from the U.S., Canada, Europe and South America. The 2008 series has 12 races lined up; the first took place last week at Sebring, Fla.

"This is a tremendous opportunity for our rising stars to shine," says Gary Rodrigues, president of the Star Mazda Championship, presented by Goodyear.

The Playboy MX-5 Cup features identically prepared Mazda MX-5 Miata sports cars and is the first professional rung on Mazda's sports car racing ladder for aspiring drivers.

Like the Star series, the MX-5 Cup is known for attracting aggressive young drivers who want to make their names in racing. Brad McAllister of Portland and Andrew Caddell of Graham, Wash., participate in the series. Talks are under way to fill out the schedule, but fans should look for a public drag-racing event on at least one evening, "show and shine" car corrals for local car clubs, and a number of competitive race groups drawn from local clubs.

It won't be Champ Car, but PIR officials still hope to attract a decent crowd of racing fans.

"We believe that if we showcase our homegrown talent on a bigger stage with Star Mazda and MX-5 Cup, we'll get a good turnout from the fans who used to come for Champ Car," track manager Mark Wigginton says. *jeffz@portlandtribune.com*

#### ASA AERO EXHAUST NORTHWEST TOUR ANNOUNCES 2008 SCHEDULE

February 2, 2008 Ellensburg, WA – Officials of the ASA Aero Exhaust Northwest Tour presented by Echo Outdoor Power Equipment are pleased with the schedule set to showcase the 2008 edition of the Northwest's top traveling stock car racing series. Nine races at six of the areas premier paved race tracks will be a challenge for all competitors.

The 2008 ASANWT takes the Northwest's best stock car drivers into three states to decide the best of the best for 2008. Five events in Washington, three in Idaho and one in Oregon will give the race fans of the northwest a chance at seeing this elite series.

ASANWT Series Administrator Ron Bennett stated "I want to thank the promoters involved in all the negotiations. Putting together this schedule was difficult as everyone wanted to avoid conflicts and preserve their standard dates." Bennett went on to say, "I want to especially thank Evergreen Speedway for moving the September date to avoid any conflicts, for the betterment of racing in the Northwest."

"Almost every NW track was involved in the scheduling process and some were just not able to find a place in their busy schedules. Each has told me that they will make room in 2009. That is very encouraging," an elated Bennett emphasized.

A first for the series will be a visit in June to Pacific Raceway's road course. The NWT has been there in the past. What makes this a first is the race will be on a Saturday night under the lights. Pacific Raceway is putting up a huge purse and touting the event as the first ever on the newly lighted 2+-mile road course.


"In putting the schedule all together we tried to stay off anyone's special stock car event and keep enough separation in our races to give the teams time to recoup and prepare for the next event. I feel we have accomplished that goal," stated Bennett.


