The 2009 GVMPS Induction Ceremony

On Sunday October 18 the Greater Vancouver Motorsport Pioneers Society held their annual induction ceremony.

In the Sports Car and Road Racing category *Ron Curties* [historian for the SCCBC] was of special interest. Starting out at Abbotsford as a driver he went on to become the first Starter at Westwood. That's him standing on the track, starters flag behind his back, getting ready to release a field of cars on the Isobel Maclaurin painting [black and white prints available, the original colour painting currently owned by Rob Dunlop] on the opening day, July 26, 1959. Ron went on to become the president of the SCCBC, twice, and had a very successful career in rallying. His plaque was presented by Tom Johnston.

Others from Sports Car and Road Racing were *Terry Nilsson* who raced at Digney Speedway in south Burnaby [right by the current Burnaby South High School] and went on to race at Westwood driving such cars as a Porsche 1600, a Lotus 17 and a Lola Mark 3 Formula Junior.

John Nissen also raced sports cars. Starting on pole position on the Isobel Maclaurin print, car # 166, as shown he also raced several different cars. He also raced at the Abbotsford Airport race circuit.

Other forms of Motorsport included:

Karting: *Al Charters*

The British Columbia Go Karting Association built the first track on Fell Ave. in North Burnaby [near the Shellburn refinery] where Al became known as the two stroke master. He went on to race at the Westwood Go Kart track [by Turn 1, the Carousel. A welder, he worked on many different types of race vehicles.

Power Boat Racing: Don Estridge

Don primarily raced 3 different boats, the first being named Skeeter. In 1959 at Harrison Lake at full speed, the boat jumped sideways about 10 feet when hit on the side by another hydroplane. Don was able to continue and finished third. When slowing down entering the pits the boat promptly sank, it seems that 6 feet of the side and frame was broken, even the seat Don was in had been hit. Skeeter 2 had a full race 392 cu. in Chrysler Hemi while another boat had a 326 cu. in. full race Jaguar V12 in it!

Drag Racing: Richard Johnston

Richard passed away in January of this year after three bouts of cancer. Starting with a 1965 Chevy at Mission Raceway [the old track] he was a primary developer of a high stall converter with a transmission brake, used to launch a heavy high horsepower engine car. He set ten national records and was well known as a developer and innovator.

Also in Drag Racing: Bob Kokotailo

Also starting at Mission with a 1965 Chevy his most notable incident was when the car lost a wheel and ended doing a couple of end over end flips. Placed in the track ambulance [someone forgot to secure the stretcher] with the back door not shut he shot out onto the track. He declined a further check up ride. His next car was a Henry J which became known as the Kokomotion. It was famous for its wheel stands and after a few rebuilds did an 8.30/171 with lots left to spare.

Land Speed Record: *Eric Langstroth*

The first Canadian to run over 200mph at Bonneville he went on to run 254 mph in his 1000hp Vega last summer. He is also a proud owner of a 200mph hat.

Motorcycle Racing: Murray Neibel

Murray was told by his father that he WAS NOT allowed to buy a motorcycle so he built his own, a 4 cylinder water cooled engine from a salvaged Mercury outboard. He was twice elected president of the Westwood Motorcycle Club and has won many national and international awards.

Collector and Restorer: *Harold Wellenbrink*

Having customized many different cars perhaps his best known is his 1952 blue Meteor convertible. Known as Cool Blue it was featured in the 2003 ICBC calendar as the December car. Having served on many boards and committees he has worked tirelessly with car clubs to promote the enjoyment and improvement of the car hobby. In addition he has worked restoring auto memorabilia such as gas pumps, air meters and oil containers.

Oval Racing: Carman Parton

Carman's early involvement included stunt driving with the Joey Chitwood Thrill Show before he went onto racing at the Langley Speedway. He also ran at Digney Speedway and also entered demo derbies at Callister Park [west across Renfrew St. from Pacific Coliseum]. Currently living at Kelowna he still puts in a full week at his shop.

Supporter-Oval Racing: Ed Roe

A mechanic for Gordie Hemrich helping Geordie win several championships with Ed getting Best Mechanic awards. Having built motors and chassis that ran at False Creek and Haney Speedways most recently Ed has been part of the Dave Hemrich Sportsman crew at Agassiz Speedway.

The Sandy Lovelace Award

Sandy was a drag racer who ran at many different BC tracks. A group of veteran Vancouver Island drag racers, Island Dragway Promoters, has funded an annual award in recognition of the "person or persons" who have made an outstanding contribution to the preservation of the history of motorsport in British Columbia.

This year's winner is the VRC [Vintage Racing Club of BC]!!
