I hope you had a good February, and your 2022 racing plans are well underway. Ryan and I have a refreshed engine back in the Camaro and new shift linkage, so we don't find 1st when aiming for 3rd.

Track Walks & Inspections

As some know MotorSportReg.com (MSR) does annual 'Tech Sessions' on various things related to putting on motorsport events. I recently attended several of these sessions, which are recorded so others can watch and pickup ideas.

One of the Tech Sessions was on doing track walks, although it was aimed at those putting on events there are things that could be some help to those working the corners and give you an idea of things to watch for: https://community.hagerty.com/t5/motorsportreg-tech-sessions/10-things-to-look-for-on-your-track-safety-inspection-24/td-p/114475.

On race day it will not always be possible to correct deficiencies, and in any cases the Steward of the event will already be aware however it never hurts to bring safety concerns to the Stewards attention, it may go on the list of things to fix for the next race weekend.

That said, I am aware of some things at Mission where a compromise has been struck, an example would be some of the poles that don't have protection around them – the last I heard, it was decided by the FIA Track Inspector that it was safer to leave the posts as they were rather than to make it hard for a car to steer either side of them by putting in a barricade.

On my track walks as an assistant race steward, I've caught things like a crowbar in a stack of tires, blocks with leading edges (usually quick to fix, but don't expect it to be fixed right away if it is minor and almost time to start the race day), and other things. Don't assume others noticed things.

Also look for hazards that may catch you, for example is your escape route clear and free of trip hazards. Some of this stuff goes without saying... but it is easy to get complacent and skip what should be part of our morning routine – like a morning meeting.

Have fun and play safe!

In that case, contact your club and request that they submit a CACC affiliation application.

Don't miss the Saturday afternoon NASCC Historic/Vintage feature race event.




