Presidents Report

Hi Everyone,

I hope you had a good June. We are at the midpoint of the racing season already. CACC Race 3, on June 23/24, was interesting to say the least, and SOVREN's big event of the year, the Pacific Northwest Historics on June 30 to July 2, 2023 was fantastic. The next CACC race is July 22/23.

CACC #3 (June 24/25)

Sadly, there were two injuries on the Saturday of the June 24/25 weekend, unfortunately I haven't heard any updates on the drivers and can only hope they are recovering.

Several 'speeding in the pits' infractions occurred as well, and were dealt with.

There was also a pace lap that was less than stellar, and a reminder that too many drivers only know the regulations through osmosis.

Just as a reminder (in case you don't look up the race regulation), although P1 sets the pace, it must be a reasonable speed and in the view of the stewards on the weekend it should also be a consistent speed. I've concluded that most driver don't know the GCRs, the Race Regs, or the supplementary regs, at least not very well (assuming they have read them at all).

One driver, that seems to have not even breezed through the regulations is now on the borderline of being sent back to the novice program.

I'm telling you all this to remind you that your reports are looked at seriously, and we also look at video evidence if available, which most times proves a driver's guilt, but on occasion, like a racing incident in Turn 1 proved a driver's innocence and caused us to suspect another driver had no place to go causing the incident. Don't get me wrong, your reports are important, and are taken as part of a bigger picture, but, when possible, we like to see as much raw (unedited) video of an incident as we can get, this has to do with viewing perspective and the fact that we can only see what appears to be going on from our vantage point, we are always trying to make a fair decision based on all the facts.

I suspect that at least part of the weekend saw some competitive and good racing. As the event Steward, I missed too much of it taking notes and dealing with drivers.

Pacific Northwest Historics (June 30 – July 2)

3 days of fun and exciting vintage racing was had in Seattle (Kent Washington to be precise). We had a strong showing of Canadian drivers to make us proud (and yes, they need our entries as much as we need theirs). VRCBC member Steve Anthonsen and I were on Turn 5 on Friday, and on Turn 6 on Saturday and Sunday. Both turns were just below where we were camped. The Americans we talked to were all very thankful for our help and experience.

Saturday was the eventful day with two or three big incidents. However, the only one with injuries requiring hospitalization was when Canadian Gord Houghton crashed into the kink before turn 1, doing significant damage to his green Sunbeam Tiger. When I conversed with Gord via email on Monday he expected to be in hospital for a few more days before staying with a friend down there until he was able to handle the 3-hour car ride home. My understanding is that his car was already on its way home by the end of racing on Saturday. Another BC driver that got in a tangle was Aaron Robbins who was hit in the side of his Formula Vee on Saturday.

I traveled down to Pacific Raceways with Steve Anthonsen, towing my (new to me) 2007 Honda Fit (which will be my vehicle when I'm in the lower mainland) behind his camper. Our trip down was uneventful enough, and we set up camp behind one of the stands by the tower. Once we leveled the camper, we relied on my Honda to get us around. The trip back however was not uneventful though, (yes, this is another saga in the adventures of Steve and Mike) all was fine until we stopped for gas near Bellis Fair Mall, where we filled up both Steve's truck and my Honda with the cheaper US gas.

As soon as Steve started his truck to do the last leg home there was a big bang and it sounded like he blew a hole in the exhaust system somewhere under the hood. Upon inspection we discovered that a sparkplug had blown out of one of the aluminum heads. Although the truck was significantly down on power, we did manage to limp back to Steve's place with the Honda on the trailer and the heavy vintage camper on the back of the truck.


