Presidents Report

June 1, 2023

Hi everyone,

I hope you had a good May. Our first few races of the year, including the British Columbia Historic Motor Races (BCHMR) and Knox Mountain Hillclimb, are behind us. The next event at Mission is the Sports Car Club of British Columbia (SCCBC) race on the June 24/25 weekend. BCHMR

Thank you to all those that volunteered on the VRCBC weekend. From the VRCBC: The BCHMR was a little under attended this year due to a less than ideal date, however the VRCBC is hoping it ended up breaking even in thanks to a grant from the Province of British Columbia and our generous sponsors such as Titanium Ford

who supplied 2 pace cars for the event.



We even had a visit from 'Penelope' Wood. Thanks to Ian entertaining us in his usual manner at the Saturday night dinner (see photo at left of Ian 'Penelope' Wood and Vince Howlett – *Photo by Debbie Simpson*).

From a racing standpoint it was clean this year, with only 2 racing incidents I'm aware of. The drivers involved, for the most part, knew that they were to report to the Black Flag pit if they were involved in body contact of any kind, and I, as the Assistant Steward found no need to have an extended conversation with any of the drivers for aggressive driving.

One of the Vintage regulations that applied to all vintage grids, including those on SCCBC weekends, is that if drivers have body contact they MUST report to the Black Flag Pit, if they are able to, and talk to the Steward about what happened. In past years this has been let slide a bit. After the number of incidents in 2022 this is being more strictly enforced

- the basic gist is that there is more of a disadvantage to aggressive driving than there is to being aggressive and making iffy passes.

Knox Mountain Hillclimb

There was only one significant "Hard Off" on the weekend, damaging a Honda's front end and moving the suspension on one side back ending that driver's weekend. The hill was fast and so were many of the drivers with the record for fastest time being broken, then broken again by the same driver, Aran Cook in a 1997 Arcobelinio Arco version 3 with a final time of 1:34.903.

The podium was also the fastest in the history of Knox with all times well under 2 minutes. All 2023 results are available at:

That weekend was the second time I've been on the Starters Stand for a race in 10 years, so I was rusty and at times slow. I have been on the Starter's Stand a couple of other times when helping on Track Days, but those are easy compared to Race Days.
