In Case You Missed It – CACC 2024 Rule changes including restoration of the red and black flag rules

The CACC motorsport disciplines have had a busy 2023 post-season with plenty of rule changes proposals reviewed and adjudicated. It's strongly recommended that all competitors and officials stay on top of changes to the CACC regulations, especially those related to your motorsport disciplines. Rule changes can be viewed on the CACC website <u>Rule Change Proposals page</u>.

For the 2024 season, there are a several rule changes that will affect a large number of CACC licensees and may require pre-season preparation.

Race Discipline:

- 1. Cameras Required Discipline members have approved a rule requiring a forward-facing camera whenever on track. This race-specific rule operates in conjunction with camera rules specified in GCR 20.12.
 - 10.1.1 All vehicles participating in any CACC-sanctioned race event must have a securely mounted forward-facing camera that poses no visual or physical obstruction to the driver. The camera must record a clear horizontal forward view whenever on track.
- 2. Class Weight Signage The Race discipline has approved a rule requiring display of the class minimum weight on all cars:
 - 9.7.3 All competition vehicles must clearly display their minimum class weight above the wheel centreline on both sides of the vehicle in lettering a minimum of two inches tall.
- 3. Restoration of the red and black flag rules The black flag all rule will once again require drivers to proceed to pit lane while the red flag indicates an immediate on-track halt.

All Disciplines:

1. Snell 2010 Helmets Expired - As of December 31, 2023, helmets carrying the Snell SA2010 and M2010 certifications are no longer allowed in CACC-sanctioned motorsport events.

Drivers shall slow down immediately, no passing and proceed to the pits. **Proposed Regulation** It is the responsibility of all drivers to stop as soon as it is safe to do so in a controlled manner at or as near the edge of the running surface as possible. Turn off engine. Drivers will remain in their cars and await instruction from a race official before proceeding. Reason for Rule Change Return to previous rule whereby race officials can suspend on track activies in a manner that allows the immediate dispatch of emergency and medical crews. Allows response vehicles to take a direct path to the incident. Our immediate racing neighbour sanctioning bodies (ICSCC and WCMA) use this proceudure for their red flag situations. Regulation as Amended and Published Proposed revision for approval at January 2024 board meeting: Drivers shall reduce speed, proceed to a position within clear view of the next flag station and stop near the edge of the running surface. Drivers shall remain in their cars and await instruction from a race official before proceeding. Status/Disposition Pending

Note: "Pending" status will change to "Approved" once the verbiage is finalized making clear the instruction to drivers where they are required to stop

2024 Thunderbird Rally

51st Thunderbird Rally -- January 27-28, 2024

Round 1 of the BC TSD Rally Championship Round 1 of the Pacific Coast Challenge Hosted by the West Coast Rally Association

The Thunderbird is a winter driving adventure, round 1 of the 2024 BC TSD Rally Championship, and round 1 of the Pacific Coast Challenge. The rally is sanctioned by Rally Pacific Motorsports (BC region of CARS), and follows the current BC TSD Rally Regulations, which are posted on http://www.rallybc.ca. The rally runs on straight-forward instructions. In addition to the route instructions, maps will be provided. The rally will be about 850km long, entirely within the province of BC, and will start with an odometer check section of about 15km. Roads will be about 40% clear pavement, 60% snow-covered pavement and gravel. Instructions are provided in both km and miles, but the official measurements and calculations are based on the km figures.





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
