The Foundation

It's often said that lightning doesn't strike twice. Well, there are two places I know that not to be true. The first is the fast paced world of motorsports, where anything can happen, and often does. And the second is the even more unpredictable realm of diseases like cancer. While no one understands the twisted course for which cancer picks it's victims, young or old, one Northwest couple certainly understands the devastating effects this disease can have on a family. Phil and Kathleen Edwards of Enumclaw, Washington have had every parent's worst nightmare come true. Twice.

In 1998, Phil and Kathleen's second child, Julie, lost her long battle with Leukemia before she even turned 2. Spurred on by Julie's passing, much of their time was spent helping to raise funds to fight cancer, in hopes that others would not suffer. They did not know at the time, that their efforts would take on an added urgency only two short years later. In April of last year, the Edwards would learn that their first child, Adam, then only 6 years old, was inflicted with the disease as well. Adam developed migraine headaches, and the pressure from a large tumor growing in his brain, caused his eyes to cross, making it nearly impossible for him to read. This was extremely difficult for Adam, as his favorite pastime was reading. Dr. Seuss being his clear favorite. After discovering the tumor, doctors at Children's Hospital and Medical Center in Seattle operated on Adam to remove the tumor. The operation was to be followed by 6 months of radiation therapy, which was to be followed by a full year of chemotherapy treatments. Sadly, Adam didn't make it to the end of his treatment, as the disease took him from his parents in March of this year.

Despite their tremendous losses, Phil and Kathleen Edwards have remained positive, hoping to make a difference in the future so other parents will not have to endure this kind of pain. The Edwards remain true to their fundraising efforts for cancer research, but feel another area of fundraising deserves their attention as well. Adams loved to read. He was a very bright child with an infectious smile, and would often share his used books with other children. In Kindergarten, Adam read at a fourth grade reading level, which inspired Adam's school, Sunrise Elementary, to dedicate a corner of the library to his memory.

The Adam Edwards Foundation was created in April of this year, and it's focus is to raise money for underprivileged children, who would otherwise not pick up a book until their first day of school. Illiteracy is a growing problem in this country and if the children are our future, a change is in order.

Our Team

The members of both USracer.com and the race team of RTG Limited consider the Edwards family friends, and we all miss the two children very much. In a show of support, USracer and RTG have teamed up, and will use our stature in the racing community to help raise money for this important cause. Adam's likeness will adorn the hood of the RTG BMW M3 at races around the country this year as we strive to put books in the hands of children that come from families that just can't afford them. Helping Hands

The team is looking for help on two levels. We have set a goal to raise \$30,000 by years end, and need donations from companies as well as the public. As a note of interest to business owners, the first 20 companies donating over \$1000 to the foundation will have their company logo placed on the hood of the car as well as it travels around the country. This offer is extended to non-business contributors as well. The next race for the team will be the June 29th race in Virginia, and will be televised on the FX network.



Race # 6 at PIR June 2/3,2001

Can you believe it? We are coming up on the halfway mark of our racing season. It seems like it was just last week we were talking about the new rule changes and thrashing on the racecars to get them ready for the 1st race at Mission. Now we are getting ready for Mission, the 7th race of the year. Speaking of rule changes, our President was right. It's time to be thinking about them. Dan and I have a long list of rule changes we will be proposing at the fall meeting.

The Portland weekend started with good weather and lots of racecars. About 240 entries I believe. There have been lots of staffing changes at Cascade Sports Car Club. I saw many new faces, getting on the job training. My personal thanks to those folks who stepped up to the plate and volunteered for jobs that most people don't want to do. Also, thank you to the drivers who exhibited patience with timing and scoreing, who were fighting computer glitches all weekend long. I personally did not see Dick Gadson, or his staff, come up for air all weekend. I'm told that a lot of the problems were caused by over 60 entry changes from drivers who couldn't make up their minds as to which class they wanted to run in!!! Dick told me that problem would be corrected by the next PIR race with new computers.

Speedvision provides a crucial service to the motorsports community, being the only cable or broadcast TV network in America to provide in-depth coverage of Formula 1, vintage, motorcycle, sports car and endurance racing, as well as amateur and other lesser-known series and events such as FIA and SCCA rallies, Trans-Am, and the annual SCCA Valvoline Runoffs. This season's flag-to-flag coverage of the Daytona, Sebring and LeMans endurance races was a rare blessing for racing fans. It would be a crime for this outstanding coverage to no longer be available to the growing motorsports community of this country. We ask FOX for caution, moderation and fairhandedness as they reformat this new addition to their fine news, sports and entertainment network.

Young driver 'over the moon' after Formula Ford win in Montreal recently.

It was the best day of Langley driver Josh Beaulieu's racing life. In just his second professional race, Beaulieu drove to his first Canadian Formula Ford win at the prestigious Air Canada Fl Grand Prix weekend in Montreal.

Beaulieu's Dowco.com Vector Ford race car started in sixth position after he had some handling problems during qualifying. By the end of the first lap of the race, Beaulieu had blitzed his way to first and held the lead for the remainder of the 41-mile race on Le Circuit Gilles Villeneuve. He pulled out to an impressive four-second lead to finish ahead of Montreal's Edouard Aube and Robert Boyer. "I am absolutely over the moon," Beaulieu said. "I was aiming for a podium finish, because we had some problems with the balance of my car in qualifying and I wasn't sure if it would be any better today. But the team really did a good job all weekend and gave me a good car for the race. It was difficult to pull away from Edouard, as he would catch me in the draft each lap, but my car's balance got better towards the second half of the race." Playing video games - so to speak - helped make him a winner. He said practicing with the FI computer game helped him learn the track. He continued, "Racing on the Formula 1 circuit gives me such a high emotional feeling. This is by far the best day so far of my racing career, and I am to keep this momentum and score some consistent strong finishes for the rest of the season.
