2003 Reno National Air Races

Reno 2003-arrival

So it's Sunday--I made it to Reno after 2 weeks on the road (but that's another story) A quick search of the pits after talking to the people at the gate I rode my bike around to see who was back for another year of speed and how many new ones came along!

The usual assortment of cowlings tool carts, golf carts, and such--the pennant flag barriers are not yet up---this helps when you happen to find an airplane fully ready to fly but parked. Like the F7F Tigercat (all black--nose name BIG BOSSMAN) Beautiful!!! This plane makes some wonderful prop whine\engine growl sounds--as unique to it as a Merlin to a P51.

Another new sound--a SAAB Draken jet fighter makes a few passes--find out that this is Skip Holme--Dago Red's pilot arriving in style.

I spend the rest of the afternoon taking pictures and talking to the many friends that I only see here.

So to Tuesday -the full moon showing the filling campground (now without the daily ever-present wind). A renewed RARE BARE showing that despite a 3 year absence it could still get up and go; laid down the glove and went 495.++ to DAGO RED'S 492.++. The games begin with a days qualifying to go. September Pops blew his engine while attempting to keep up the pressure then went off the end of the runway landing. All safe but no spare engine (or cylinders) to install, was cleaned and parked for the week.

Also conspicuous by his absence was Tiger Destefani and Strega. With no motor, rumour has that Bill is thinking of "retirement" and possibly assisting with the pace plane duties.

Local pilot in T-6 class, Keith Mcmann, qualified at a respectable 212.33 mph in the "Red Knight" Harvard. Showing steady improvement in speed each year, (last year 207 mph)

In sport class we have a good assortment of kit planes competing this year. No less than 4 Harmon Rockets, 7 Glasiars,3 Lancairs, 1 SX300, 1 Edge 540 aerobatic airplane, and don't leave out the smallest engine in class-- Klaus Savier in a Vari-Eze--doing 235 mph laps. Also in the class is it's first female pilot--flying a Glasair 3 -Vicki Cruse (also a member of the US Aerobatic Team) appears to be having fun flying the pylons.

Wednesday--The final day of qualifying for those who have been tinkering or who have had to do repair work to overstressed engines it is now or next year. The day goes along well with only a few disappointments--- The F7F Tigercat screamed along to a 366 mph qualifying speed to immediately find that 1 engine was making metal bits internally and maydayed to land. This makes 2 of Mike Brown's aircraft that need an engine to get home (he brought 2 Sea Fury's and the Tigercat) The airshow and races all start on Thursday with grand opening by the US Airforce Thunderbirds. We got off to a roaring good morning! The day has several heat races by all classes. Among the good natured chatter by the pylon crews and the press was wondering which would be the first to scrape the paint off the now bright white pylon markers; as some pilots try to make the course as tight as possible. An enjoyable day.

507+ miles per hour !!!! The magic number has been broken!! In the first unlimited gold at the 2003 Reno National Air Races Dago Red P51 screamed to a race average of 507. With a lap timed at 511.528 mph.-- Content to sit back(if you call 498 mph) and see what happens Rare Bare watched from a disappearing 2nd place. Dago almost started to lap the field in less than 7 laps as the first lap was wing to wing. (more on this aircraft later)

Don't get me wrong here--the rest of the racing was just as close--but not quite as fast. Many T-6s were still almost trading paint with the pylons as they roared past on their way to finishing some exciting racing! Local pilot Keith Mcmann was denied a sure victory in his race by only .21 seconds/ O.1 mph. This equates to my seeing him an entire fuselage ahead at the last pylon before finish and being passed just at the line.

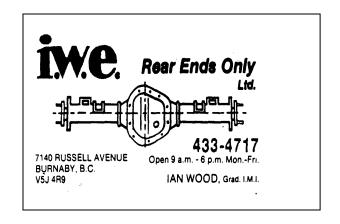
