
May 8th, 2007


VP Rambling

The first race weekend of the year passed with a disappointing turnout of workers, at least on Sunday. I had to work on Saturday so was a no show. This doesn't bode well for the coming year; however those that didn't show missed a good turnout for the WSC, which actually had some real racing, at least in P4.

The new worker platform at turn 7 is no longer fastened to the wall, however I understand on Saturday the block that had been place 90% to the blocks along the track blocked egress from the platform (see diagram of "Original setup"). Please note that my diagrams are **not** to scale.



This was rectified by placing the block at a slight angle (see diagram of "Final setup"), although it no longer gives as much resistance to the wall moving, it is possible to get on and off the platform without climbing over the block.

The new platform is far safer, in that the original one was fastened to a block that was able to move. The downside is that those of us that used to like blue flagging from the end of the block/worker station can no longer do so safely as the angled block is in the way of your escape route. Andrew Slater and I found that we leaned over the railing on the turn station when blue flagging so the catch fence didn't obstruct our view (probably why we flagged from the end of the blocks before). Mid morning when I went to throw some coffee at Rick I discovered that his plaque was gone, it was taken for safe keeping due to the flood threat, I sent him some coffee anyway since I'm sure his spirit is still there.




